A dozen students participated in the Competitions. The Essay Competition was won by Rebecca Nelsey for an essay on Zwarte Piet and the Podcast Competition by a team led by Daniel Corcoran on Rosie and Moussa by Michael De Cock. The ANS Adjudication team (to whom we are hugely grateful) were rewarded by some rich reading and listening experiences. We were able to congratulate the students and the Faculty for the high quality of the students' work, produced under such challenging circumstances of lockdown. The winning essay and a summary of the winning podcast, together with a link to it, will be published in the Newsletter in due course.

The Ambassador of the Netherlands, HE Mr Karel van Oosterom, kindly attended the event, as did our President, Lord Taylor of Holbeach, Chairman Dick van den Broek, other Council members and Judges. The University were represented by Professor Emeritus Michael Perraudin, Head of Germanic Studies Professor Henk de Berg, and of course Dr Henriette Louwerse and Filip de Ceuster of the Centre for Dutch and Flemish Studies, who were instrumental in arranging a highly successful event, attended by some 30 in total.
