The Van de Veldes, Greenwich, Art and the Sea, Queen's House - Wednesday April 2pm



After our Unilever Lecture it is time to set sail for Greenwich and experience the world's largest collection of two leading Golden Age marine artists. The exhibition marks 350 years since Willem van de Velde the Elder and Willem van de Velde the Younger moved to England and were granted a studio at the Queen's House by Charles II. It celebrates the Anglo-Dutch cultural exchange that continued in the late seventeenth century. It shows how two Dutch artists could establish the 'English' school of marine painting that would inspire J.M.W. Turner.
